as mirrors with beveled, polished (penciled/flat) edges, or mirrors with specific holes, and screen printing. Our mirrors can be custom cut, as per our customers' request- for example, into oval, round, half-moon, arch-top and other designs.

New Float Line in Wuhan

On the 6th of June, our 6th float line began production in Wuhan, Hubei Province, with an output of approximately 600 tons per day.

Our latest float line incorporates the newest domestic technology with one particularly notable feature: its combustion system uses natural gas instead of heavy oil, thus making this line a "green" line.
