CNC Machine



Computer Numerical Controlled (CNC) machines produce highly accurate results with tight tolerance limits. For glass edgework they can produce seamless looking edges even where the connection points occurs. CNC machines can also polish the inside edges of circular/round shaped glass which cannot be done by regular polishing machines. The minimum radius that can be achieved by the equipment at Intex Glass is 60mm. The cost for polishing by CNC machines is higher than polishing by common polishing equipment.

Brief introduction for Dragon Boat Day (Double Fifth Festival)

Dragon Boat Day is one of the four most important Chinese traditional festivals; the other three are Spring Festival, Tomb-sweeping Day and Mid-Autumn Festival. It is a festival to commemorate Qu Yuan who was one of the greatest patriots and poets in ancient China, Qu Yuan lived in the Spring and Autumn period (B.C.770~B.C.476) which was a most chaotic time because of war. He jumped into the Miluo River to sacrifice himself for his motherland and to express his sadness for the approaching subjugation. His countrymen threw a lot of Zongzi into the Miluo River to feed the fish, in the hope of protecting his body from fish while looking for it from a boat. This is the origin of the Dragon boat races and the Zongzi glutinous rice cakes.

The Dragon Boat Day is on May 5th of Chinese lunar calendar, which is on June 16th of the Gregorian calendar this year. Cucumber, eel, salted duck eggs, and tofu are all festival foods besides Zongzi. Those are what moon cakes are for Mid-Autumn Festival. Wine with certain additive is the required drink on Dragon Boat Day.
